DECLARATION

I, DEANNE CHAPMAN, aka DEE CHAPMAN, if called as a witness at the trial of Darold Stenson would have been able to testify to the following:

This statement (consisting of 1 page(s)) is made freely, voluntarily and without any threats or promises.

1. I first met David Oberman some time around the Fall of 1993 through a local Port Angeles newspaper ad and became romantically involved with him.

2. I moved in with David Oberman onto Dakota Farms some time in late Fall 1994 where I lived with him for approximately three months.

3. I had a conversation with David Oberman regarding the murder weapon used to kill Frank Hoerner and Denise Stenson. During that conversation, Oberman told me that the .357 initially belonged to him, but that the .357 disappeared from the travel trailer that he and Reed were living in at Dakota Farms several weeks prior to the murders.

4. He told to me that he did not tell the police about the ownership of this .357 because he was afraid they would implicate him in the murders.

5. During my stay at Dakota Farms, David Oberman asked me to hide a "digging bar" which was approximately a 5' by 2" round bar that tapered off to a sharp point and was used for digging holes in the earth. Oberman told me that this bar was used to hit Frank Hoerner on the head. I then took the bar and hid it in the ostrich barn, placing it between the wall and the ostrich egg incubator.

I have been allowed to make any corrections or additions that I wish. I do not have any significant or additional information to add.

I declare under the penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Washington that the foregoing information is true and correct to the best of knowledge and belief.
